A One Day Safety Day!

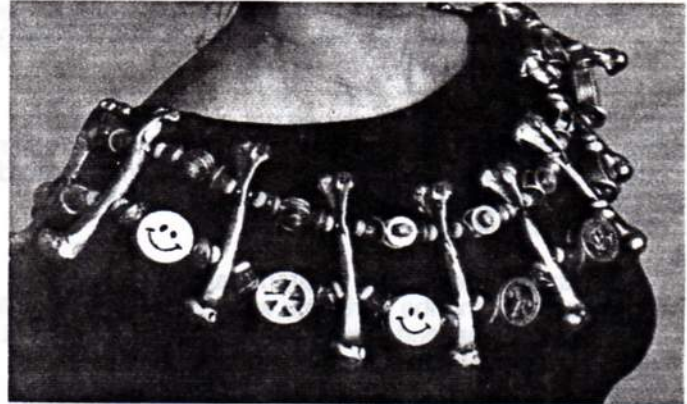
